HIS PROBLEM	People treated him badly because of his horrible appearance.	Quasimodo was born with a hunchback and feared by the townspeople as a sort of monster	He had Proteus syndrome, a bizarre condition in which a mutant gene causes asymmetrical growth of body parts.
COULD HE BE HAPPY?	No, because of the people, he became bad.	At the end yes.	He was happy, but when his mother dies, he felt sad and never became happy again.
HOW DID HIS LIFE END?	Victor Frankenstein dies wishing that he could destroy the Monster he created.	In this book, Frollo betrays Esmerelda by handing her into the authorities and she is sentenced to death for a crime he committed. Frollo watches her public hanging from the cathedral balcony and laughs as she dies, prompting Quasimodo to push him to his death in a fit of rage.	He ended up living out the rest of his life in London Hospital under the care of surgeon Frederick Treves, and passed away on April 11, 1890. Merrick was found leaning over, and the official cause of death was listed as asphyxia caused by his unique condition.
